

Program Self-Study and the 10-Year Site Visit

The first 10-year accreditation site visits will be scheduled in February 2017 for programs that underwent their self-study in the summer of 2015. The goal for this visit is a full review of the program against all applicable standards, as well as a review of program improvement in areas the program identified during its self-study 12 to 18 months earlier.

This webinar will provide a range of practical suggestions for making and documenting program improvement through the annual evaluation, and the self-study, and will be relevant to programs with an impending self-study, or 10-year accreditation site visit, as well as programs who wish to prepare well in advance for a self-study scheduled years from now.

Objectives:

At the end of this session, the learner should be able to:

- Describe how program improvement can be informed by a focus on program aims, and environmental context, and the question "What will take this program to the next level?";
- List useful data sources, practical strategies, and efficient ways to track outcomes for improvement efforts resulting from annual program evaluations and the self-study;
- Review preparation, and data aggregation and presentation strategies that may contribute to a successful 10-year accreditation site visit; and
- Answer selected pre-submitted questions about program improvement through the annual program evaluation and the self-study, and about the 10-year site visit.

Ingrid Philibert, PhD, MBA, is the Senior Vice President, Field Activities of the ACGME and also functions as the Executive Managing Editor of the *Journal of Graduate Medical Education*. She is one of the designers of the protocol for the self-study and the 10-year accreditation site visit, has performed a number of self-study pilot visits, and is the lead investigator in the effort to aggregate and interpret data from early program self-studies for dissemination to the graduate medical education community.
