Developing GME Leaders: Professional Development and Career Advancement for Program Administrators and Coordinators

With the implementation of the Next Accreditation System, the role of the Residency and Fellowship Coordinator or Administrator has vastly changed. What was once seen merely as a clerical position has evolved into a vital role for residency programs due to the rigorous accreditation requirements and increased accountability placed on each program.
