No matter how smart a physician is, an unprofessional physician comes across as a bad doctor.

Professionalism is a core competency for resident physicians across all disciplines. Professionalism milestones aim to assist faculty in observation, assessment and feedback of trainees; however, this is one of the most difficult areas to evaluate. Information from Phase I and II Programs professionalism milestones may help guide this educational effort.

Objectives:

Previously, he served as the Chief Medical Officer and Senior Vice President of the American Board of Internal Medicine and the ABIM Foundation. Dr. Holmboe has been a national leader in the development of milestones, EPA's and faculty development in observation, evaluation and feedback.
